Note: In his Attestation Paper, January 4, 1915, Robert Porter indicated that he had no military experience. Yet, within less than two months of enrolment, he was promoted directly from Private to Sergeant and shortly before the Battle of Beaumont Hamel, he was again promoted, this time to Company Sergeant Major. Obviously, he was a person with outstanding leadership abilities and could have had an outstanding future had he not fallen in battle.
